

Annals of Family Medicine Policy on Supplements

The *Annals of Family Medicine* may publish supplements at the discretion of the editor and publisher.

Editorial Focus

- Supplements must be in harmony with the editorial mission and objectives of the *Annals of Family Medicine*.
- The subject and content of the supplement should advance primary care practice, policy, education, or research.

Sponsorship and Conflicts of Interest

- Organizers of the supplement are responsible for obtaining full funding. Funding must be non-commercial.
- Organizers of the supplement must disclose all potential conflicts of interest (financial and non-financial) pertaining to the supplement. This includes (but is not limited to) relationships between the funding source and the authors/guest editors, and the role of the funding source in research design, data collection/analysis, decision to publish, and choice of journal.
- The editors will review supplement proposals for potential conflicts of interest.
- We suggest that authors review the National Library of Medicine's policy on "Conflict of Interest Disclosure and Journal Supplements in MEDLINE®: Best Practices" at https://www.nlm.nih.gov/bsd/policy/conflict_of_interest.html.

Editorial Processes

- Each element of the supplement is subject to the regular editorial and peer review processes of the *Annals of Family Medicine*.
- The editor has sole control over acceptance of all elements of the supplement.

Pricing

- Cost estimates, pricing, and formal quotes are determined by the publisher based on the specifics of the supplement proposal.
